Development of Thinking among Young Learners

How do you teach thinking? The assumption is this that if you teach all the facts, thinking will simply occur as a natural extension of learning. It is a natural process to get back the same that you give. If you teach them facts, what you're going to get back are facts. If your focus is on basic skills, most likely that's what they'll show you.


During the past few years I have come across many people who want their children to learn and reproduce the facts whether they are beneficial for their children or not. My answer for them here is that at Montessori our focus is not to make children machines of reproducing the facts but to help them acquire the basic life skills and practice their thinking skills, which will help them in their practical lives. For example, being organized, being able to perform daily life tasks with perfection, being able to resolve conflicts, being able to cooperate and help others. Practical life exercises play a very important role in building your child's concentration and refresh them for learning facts. Children develop skills the way builders build a house; they start with the foundation- what gets built on that foundation at different stages of development determines what the house looks like. We all want our children to be able to analyze information, make decisions, and be problem solvers. Helping children to develop thinking skills early is essential to their academic success.

We at FMS focus on fine motor skills as well as gross motor skill development, with purposeful activities like spooning, mixing, sorting as well as matching. Their hands are being prepared through these exercises. A child who is ready for writing and is not able to hold the pencil, polishing and washing exercises are given more often so they become capable of writing. Our teachers get amazed how

quickly they start writing after performing these tasks. So, slow down andencourage your children to help you in your daily house hold tasks and help them to build

their confidence and concentration. Thinking requires concentration. Once they are able to stay on a task for longer periods of duration, they will soon able to sit, read, write and think. That is what is required in school life.

By the grace of Almighty Allah and blessings of 14 Masoomeen (A.S), we are now able to infuse Montessori philosophy into our grade 1 classrooms. The students are divided into smaller groups and are given the opportunity to work with material along with the traditional method of teaching. Our teachers are working hard to develop thinking skills among the students of class 1 & 2. Learning of puzzle words, composition and picture writing and Mental Math are being done on regular basis. The student's are assessed on the basis of formative and summative tests. Their classroom performance is also logged down on a daily basis.

Library and Culture rooms at FMS

FMS believes that audio-visual learning is an integral part of education during primary years. To facilitate this learning process FMS has setup two technology-aided libraries along with rich resource of local and international publications. One library is in the basement of FMS building and another for class 1 & 2 is located at the first floor of FGS campus.

To introduce Geography, History, Science and cultural topics at pre-primary level, a Culture Room has also been set up in the basement at FMS building.
